Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for a full-time, fixed term position as a Postdoctoral Researcher with the Centre for Chromosome Biology, School of Biological and Chemical Sciences at University of Galway.

Salary: Postdoctoral Researcher salary scale €46,305 - €59,063 per annum, (subject to the project's funding limitations), and pro rata for shorter and/or part-time contracts.

JOB DESCRIPTION

Job Description:

The successful candidate will conduct research on the molecular/cellular mechanisms that control sexual development in the cnidarian *Hydractinia symbiolongicarpus*. She or he will be the lead postdoctoral researcher responsible for the day-to-day coordination and management of the study, including performing wet-lab experiments, bioinformatic analysis of the data, and providing supervision to undergraduate and postgraduate researchers. The postdoc will present her or his data in international meetings and peer-reviewed journals, and also apply for funding to external agencies.

Duties:

Perform the principal aspects of the laboratory work associated with the project





- Provide intellectual input into the research
- Supervise junior undergraduate and postgraduate researchers in the lab
- Disseminate the project's outputs through presentations at international conferences and peer-reviewed journal publications
- Carry out other appropriate and relevant duties under the direction of the Principal Investigator
- Any other duties assigned commensurate to this level of post
