Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for a full-time, fixed term position as a post-doctoral researcher with Children's Studies at the University of Galway, Ireland.

This position is funded by Research Ireland/Taighde Éireann (formerly known as an SFI-IRC Pathways Award) and is available from January 1 2026 to contract end date of December 15 2027.

Salary: Postdoctoral Researcher salary scale €46,305 - €59,063 per annum, (subject to the project's funding limitations), and pro rata for shorter and/or part-time contracts.

The default position for all new public sector appointments is the 1st point of the salary scale. This may be reviewed, and consideration afforded to appointment at a higher point on the payscale (subject to the project's funding limitations), where evidence of prior years' equivalent experience is accepted in determining placement on the scale above point 1, subject to the maximum of the scale. JOB DESCRIPTION

Job Description:

The successful candidate will will work closely with the PI Dr. Cassie Smith-Christmas and associated GAELFAM researchers in conducting, disseminating, and communicating the main findings of the GAELFAM project. GAELFAM takes an ethnographic approach to understand more about the everyday linguistic experiences of families who reside in Irish Gaeltacht areas and who use a language other than/in addition to Irish or English in the home.

- Conduct project fieldwork, which includes but is not limited to semi-structured interviews with families who fit the GAELFAM profile; multimodal language diaries with selected families, ethnography of the families' local area(s); semi-structured interviews with the cúntóirí teangain the areas in which the families live
- Transcription of data, both of data collected by researcher and data previously collected for the GAELFAM project
- Analysis of data, both of data collected by researcher and data previously collected for the GAELFAM project
- Publish articles (both single and co-authored with other project team members) in high-level peer-reviewed academic journals
- Build and maintain project website; maintain project blog
- Present project findings at the number of national and international conferences
- Chair one stakeholder event with youth engagement focus
- Any other duties assigned commensurate to this level of post
