The Role

Maynooth University is committed to a strategy in which the primary University goals of excellent research and scholarship and outstanding education are interlinked and equally valued.

Maynooth University is committed to world-class research and collaboration. Situated within the School of Business is a NORF-funded project ROCHE (Review of Open Research in Health Ecosystems). ROCHE brings together a team of researchers from Maynooth University, University College Dublin and Anglim Consulting. The project is working to explore and develop policies, practices, challenges, and opportunities for open research in commercialisable research, particularly in Connected Health.

We are seeking an excellent self-started and highly motivated candidate to join our research project. The role will provide research and technical support to explore how public-private research partnerships impact on open research mandates when intellectual property rights are at stake. The successful candidate will play a key role in assisting Co-PIs and the research team in finding solutions to the research questions posed.

Principal Duties

Administrative and other duties:

This will include:

- Close collaboration with the Co-PIs and project team to ensure the efficient running of the project
- Administration, conducting, and transcribing interview using software tools where appropriate
- Updating project records and maintenance of the project database
- Conducting data analysis and identifying patterns and trends which inform the project's objectives
- Generating visualisations and reports from data collected during interviews and surveys
- Writing up of literature reviews and aligning findings to identify new insights which support the outputs of the project
- Participating in project meetings, providing feedback and updates on project goals

- Background in graphic design and Website maintenance.
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills
- Experience working in teams in academic or research environments
- Evidence of taking Initiative and motivation to work independently
- Experience in coding and conducting surveys: Familiarity with Atlas.ti and Qualtrics software.

Department

The School of Business

The School of Business community includes approximately 65 faculty and 8 professional service staff coming from 20 countries, and a team of occasional lecturers. We are currently actively recruiting additional faculty and professional service staff to reinforce enacting our mission and values. Together we support a community of approximately 2,350 full-time equivalent students across 19 undergraduate, 12 taught postgraduate, and PhD degrees. Our research active faculty work in partnership with our full time university tutors and doctoral scholarship students to implement research informed, practice engaged education. Our university tutors are especially targeted at supporting our Living Laboratory learning experiences, where industry projects and skills are integrated into the learning journey.

As a community, we are guided by our mission, values and purpose (see Table 1). We have experienced considerable growth in the last six years: in terms of business students we have grown by over 150%. Our team of faculty and professional services staff has similarly grown. Our research has increased significantly in terms of quality of outlets, volume, and breadth of domain coverage. Our disciplinary expertise is primarily in the areas of management (including strategy, organisational behaviour, human resource management, ethics, entrepreneurship, international business and innovation), marketing, accounting, finance, management information systems (MIS), operations and supply chain.

Students from multiple disciplines work in shared modules, developing shared life experiences and a common language of work. Our undergraduate education is broadly across three groups:

- Single honours degrees in Accounting, Business and Management; Business and Global Cultures; Finance; International Business; Marketing; and Entrepreneurship;
- Bachelor of Arts degree students, who can combine one of five business subjects (Finance,

Accounting, Management; Marketing; International Business), with 22 other subjects across the university

- Double degrees with Law combining any of the following: Accounting or Business.
- Double Degrees with Modern Languages, combining a Business subject (choice of Accounting, Finance, Management; Marketing; International Business) and a language (Chinese; French; German; Spanish)
