## Department of Design Innovation & School of Business Professor (B) in Health Design (Permanent)

### The Role

Maynooth University seeks an outstanding academic to join our staff as Professor (B) in Health Design. This is an opportunity for you to shape our research, teaching and impact in the field of Health Design. You will be embedded in a large community of design and business academics, and our growing field of Health and Wellbeing across the University. This role fits into a strategy of sustained investment and growth in capacity in both Design Innovation and the School of Business, resulting in growth in education programmes, research grants, research impact and multiple awards by students (e.g. Dyson Innovation awards) and staff for their work. This is one of three new Health and Wellbeing Professorships in the Faculty of Social Sciences, as part of our commitment to deepen capacity and impact in this field.

The University is making a strategic investment in the field of Health and Wellbeing, involving creation of new education programmes, and widening our research impact in this field. Together, the Health and Wellbeing Professors will collaborate across Departments, Schools and the wider University to strengthen interdisciplinary research, education and engagement, and to maximise collective societal impact in this area.

Maynooth University is committed to a strategy in which the primary university goals of excellent research and scholarship and outstanding education are interlinked and equally valued. Professors will be expected to provide significant intellectual leadership, through a demonstrated commitment to both education and research, and also to contribute to the effective leadership and management of the department, the faculty and the university.



This new Professor post is part of the university commitment to our Health and Wellbeing research beacon of our Strategic Plan 2023-28. The appointee will contribute research informed, practice engaged, education and societal impact that demonstrates Maynooth University's impact in the Health and Wellbeing of Ireland and Europe.

We seek an exceptional internationally recognised scholar with an outstanding portfolio of high-ranking publications, significant grant awards, and evidence of demonstrable impact on health policy, governance, and systems transformation; and evidence of excellent service must include leadership in programme development that has generated scale in students, and internationalisation. This is a unique opportunity to shape a growing field at the intersection of design, health, and systems innovation. This post supports Maynooth University's strategic goals in research excellence, societal impact, enhancing teaching and learning, and internationalisation.

This is a full-time role and is likely to be incompatible with an active career in design practice.

## Research

At Professor B level, the postholder is expected to provide intellectual and academic leadership, shape strategic direction in their field, secure and lead externally funded research at scale, and deliver demonstrable impact in research, education, and engagement at national and international levels.

The successful candidate will lead co-disciplinary research that integrates design thinking, user-need approaches, and business strategy to address complex challenges in health systems and environments. A salutogenic perspective, focusing on the creation of conditions that support health and well-being, is appreciated, alongside expertise in process-driven, applied research. The postholder will lead the research and the development of toolkits, technologies, and strategies that promote well-being at individual, community, and population levels.

This role offers a unique opportunity to shape the future of health design through collaboration with business scholars, health professionals, and policymakers and address the complex interplay between physical and mental health, social determinants, and environmental factors. Candidates should demonstrate a track record of influencing health service delivery or governance frameworks, and a commitment to research that delivers real-world impact.

## Teaching

We welcome applicants with a proven excellence for interdisciplinary teaching and mentoring, and a vision for advancing design-led innovation in health through academic and industry partnerships.

The successful candidate will assist with important developments in the suite of Undergraduate, Masters and Research programmes in the Department of Design Innovation and School of Business. This will involve (amongst other initiatives) taking a role in scoping out a Masters in Design for Healthcare Futures (or other programmes that are student demand lead), drawing on their knowledge of the health innovation space to help develop a programme that responds to the needs of future healthcare innovators.

The successful candidate will have the ability to teach advanced design-led innovation techniques, drawing on the toolkits of design thinking and strategic design to ensure that students on the BSc Product Design & Innovation and Design Innovation's PG programmes continue to understand the value of integrating design methods into the innovation process. They will also contribute to the integration of design perspectives into Healthcare Management programmes in the School of Business.

## Principal Responsibilities

### A Professor of the University is expected to:

- Be an international leader in research and scholarship and contribute to the advancement of knowledge in the field of Health Design;
- Provide leadership in research and scholarship within the Department, Faculty and University;
- Promote excellence in teaching and learning, and encourage innovation in teaching and learning amongst staff;
- Contribute to the teaching of undergraduate and postgraduate students, including lecturing, consultations with individual students, and supervision of research students;
- Contribute to the development of the curriculum and academic programmes within the discipline and more generally;
- Assume responsibilities for management and administrative tasks associated with the Department, Faculty and University;
- Be an active member of the University and contribute to the work of the University in outreach, collaboration, internationalisation, engagement and policy development.

Professors of the University are required to serve as Head of Department when requested to do so by the President.

## Principal Duties

### Research & Scholarship:

Building a research and scholarly profile is an essential part of an academic career. This will include:

- Leading research and engaging in Health Design scholarship of international quality, impact, and substance.
- Disseminating research and scholarly outcomes through: top international peer-reviewed publication outlets; presentation at leading international and national conferences; preparation of professional reports; commercialisation; or other appropriate means.
- Generating significant external research income and resources from national and international funding bodies to sustain, deepen and expand the health design research profile and capacity of the School/Department and of Maynooth University.
- Fostering links with other institutions that will benefit both research and teaching at Maynooth University.
- Supervising research students and post-doctoral fellows.
- Affiliating with a University Research Institute, where appropriate;
- Integrating research into the teaching curriculum.

### Teaching:

Please note that as part of the workload allocation process, teaching duties are assigned by the Head of the School of Business and the Head of Department of Design Innovation, their delegate or the Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences. For joint appointments to two or more Departments/Schools workload allocation is discussed between the Heads and the Dean to ensure appropriate resource allocation.

These duties will include:

- Teaching and assessing students at undergraduate and postgraduate level. This may include lecturing, tutoring, leading practical learning activities, project supervision, and setting, supervising and grading assessments;
- Demonstrating excellence and innovation in teaching and learning and encouraging innovation in teaching and learning amongst colleagues.
- Contributing to the development and enhancement of the curriculum and academic programmes within the discipline, including designing and delivering new programmes and modules.
- Contributing to the assurance and enhancement of teaching quality.
- Engaging in outreach and promotional activities and the recruitment and selection of undergraduate and postgraduate students.

### Administration and Service:

The academic staff members of the University are critical to achieving the strategic objectives of the University, and as such are required to engage in work that serves the collective strategic needs of the University. This may include:

- Assuming responsibilities for management and administrative duties as assigned by the Head of School/Department, their delegate, the Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences, or President of the University.
- Attending and serving on Departmental/School, Faculty, Institute and University committees as appropriate;

- Leading or contributing to strategic projects and initiatives;
- Supporting the strategy development and implementation of the Department/School and University with advice, support, and assuming service leadership roles and committee memberships as requested by the Head of School or university leadership.
- Leading initiatives that contribute to the internationalisation of the University.
- Collaborative work with external partners;
- Being an active member of the Departmental/School, Faculty and University and contributing to the work of all three in outreach, collaboration, engagement, and policy development.
- Attending courses and engaging in other activities associated with professional development as appropriate;
- Complying with all University policies.

Please note that service duties as they relate to the School, Department, Subject, Faculty, or university may be assigned as part of the workload allocation process by the Head of School, their delegate or the Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences. - A PhD in Design or a cognate Design-related discipline (Innovation, Anthropology, Health, Development Studies, Business Design).

#### **Research:**

- A research focus on and extensive scholarship in the field of health, wellbeing and design.
- Be able to demonstrate an outstanding record of research and scholarship, reflected in an excellent research funding record, and an outstanding publication profile.
- In particular, have an established track record of publication in top-tier international peer-reviewed journals, and internationally excellent research books, reflected in an excellent publication profile expected of a full Professor of Health Design.
- Have an active research pipeline with potential for further international peer-reviewed publication, demonstrating the ability to sustain and deepen their research contribution over time.
- Demonstrate capability to undertake and achieve success in substantial external research funding applications.
- Experience of leading funded research programmes.

- Experience of successfully raising external research funds at a national or international level.
- A productive research network and international academic experience.
- Demonstrable experience of Human-Centred Design / Innovation process;
- Demonstrable skills in applied Qualitative / Design research methods.

### **Teaching:**

- An outstanding academic record as a university teacher, with extensive experience of teaching at undergraduate, postgraduate and executive levels in the field of design.
- A demonstrated record as an educational innovator, with a proven track record of programme and curriculum development, especially within the discipline of design.
- Extensive experience supervising doctoral level students to completion and mentoring early career academics.
- Capacity to teach in the field of health design with a willingness and capacity to teach outside core areas of research focus in the broad field of design innovation.

### **Leadership:**

- The capacity to offer strong academic leadership within the School/Department, Faculty and across the University.
- Experience of and commitment to working in an interdisciplinary setting (particularly, the capacity to collaborate with colleagues inside and outside the University with a view to developing interdisciplinary initiatives in the field of health and wellbeing).
- Excellent administrative and management skills, including experience of programme development and leadership.
- A willingness to undertake leadership roles within the School/Department, Faculty and University, if requested to do so.
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills.

## Faculty and Research Institutes



The Faculty of Social Sciences is a wonderfully diverse team of over 358 full time staff, and 64 researchers, in addition to a community of occasional staff providing specialised practice and disciplinary knowledge. As a community we support the learning journey of over 53% of all Maynooth University undergraduate, postgraduate and PhD students (8,239 FTE students). We are committed to publishing our research and community impact. We have published over 1,220 journal and book contributions in 2022-25 and obtained over €17.7 million (2024-25) in research funding from multiple sources including the European Union, the Irish Research Council, Enterprise Ireland, and Science Foundation Ireland amongst others. At the heart of our community is the impact that our students make as graduates and the interaction that our researchers have with communities on the ground to improve the lives and welfare of people in Ireland, Europe and worldwide.

The Departments and Schools in our community are led by the Heads of Adult and Community Education, Anthropology, Applied Social Studies, Design Innovation, Economics, Education, Froebel Department of Primary and Early Childhood Education, Geography, the School of Law and Criminology, the School of Business, and Sociology. Several of our communities are ranked higher than the University ranking in the Times Higher Education (THE) World Rankings 2026, including Law (251-300), Social Sciences (301-400), Business and Economics (401-500), Education (401-500).

As a faculty team we work to support the formation and implementation of the Maynooth University Strategic Plan. We are proud of our contributions to the Research Beacons of the University, especially our work in the fields of Sustainability and Climate Change, Data and Digital Transformation, Society and Public Policy, Health and Wellbeing. We have been at the heart of growth and transformation of education programmes in Maynooth University.

We have launched multiple new undergraduate and taught postgraduate programmes, resulting in significant growth in domestic and international student numbers of 8.5% since 2022, in addition to new doctoral programmes. We are proud of our focus on providing both research informed and practice engaged education for our students so that they have fast burn skills and concepts they can use immediately upon graduation, and foundational concepts and experiences that will enable them to adapt to changing conditions over time.

Impactful education and research require a community of staff that can take the time to support students and projects effectively. To this end we have increased the academic staffing of the faculty by over 15% since 2022. Our recruitment has focused on attracting the best talent from around the world. We are proud of the diversity of our staff in terms of disciplines, local and international experience. We hope that you

will consider applying for this post and strengthening our research and education impact.

The Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences has executive responsibility for units within the faculty, including resource allocation, strategic development, and operational alignment with university policy and, processes, and leadership of the faculty. The Heads of Department, Schools and Associate Deans (including research, teaching and learning, and international amongst others) report directly to the Dean.

The role of the Faculty is to coordinate the academic activities of individual departments/schools, to oversee the strategic development of departments/schools, manage risk, governance, and to support interdepartmental programmes. Several of the university Designated Research Institutes and Centres are primarily associated with the Faculty of Social Sciences, including the Maynooth University Social Sciences Institute (MUSSI), ICARUS, IVI and the ALL Institute. Our research is particularly strong at an interdisciplinary level.

The Faculty of Social Sciences is committed to supporting implementation of the university Strategic Plan 2023-28, including its impact agenda in the space of Health and Wellbeing, hence it is recruiting a team of Professors in this space across the Faculty. These will work within their Departments and Schools, to advance teaching, research, and impact in this area, as well as coordinating their work across the faculty and university to maximize collective impact in the Health and Wellbeing field for Ireland and Europe.

### **Department of Design Innovation**

In the last five years we have been undertaking a process of sustained investment in the next generation of Design Innovation faculty, actively recruiting new staff. The Department of Design Innovation utilises interdisciplinary expertise to combine industrial, entrepreneurial and academic excellence in Design. It is focused on developing research and user-centred, applied practitioners that create impact through design innovation in industries across Ireland and Europe. It distinguishes itself from other design courses by placing emphasis on research methods, user experience, marketing, business models and the commercial justification of new product proposals, as well as core science and engineering subjects.

It offers a four-year undergraduate degree in Product Design, and a one- to two-year MSc Design Innovation and MSc Design for UX&I. The Department has a number of PhD students in Design and multi-disciplinary subjects.

## School of Business
